He depended on the back of the wheelchair for postural stability and on his family/caregiver to stand. With his positive attitude and hard work, he now sits upright away from the back of the wheelchair with a caregiver nearby and can turn his body and head. With minimal assistance, he can stand holding onto the parallel bar and move to/from his wheelchair. Such gains have made it easier for him to socialize with students and staff and participate in class activities as well as for his family/caregiver to help him with tasks at home. - 1. You can find this form from District Intranet purchasing page. Link: Fixed Asset Disposal Request
- 2. Submit original form to Supervisor for approval.
- 3. Wait for Supervisor and Purchasing Department to get Board approval.
- 4. Notify custodian to dispose of equipment when you receive final approval by Board.

The number of pedestrians killed on California roadways continues to rise at an alarming rate. In 2016, 867 pedestrians died, a nearly 33 percent increase from 2012. More than 14,000 pedestrians were injured. "At some point, we are all pedestrians," OTS Director Rhonda Craft said. "Let's take a step back from the hustle and bustle in our lives and start looking out for one another, both in the car and outside of it."
