The Skills Plus community helped him in preparing for his trip through problem-solving communication issues and modifying phone service, etc. One student downloaded the google translate application and trained him to use it. Additionally, a few people gave him their phone numbers for emergencies.

STUDENT SUCCESS STORY




NEW STAFF MEMERS
